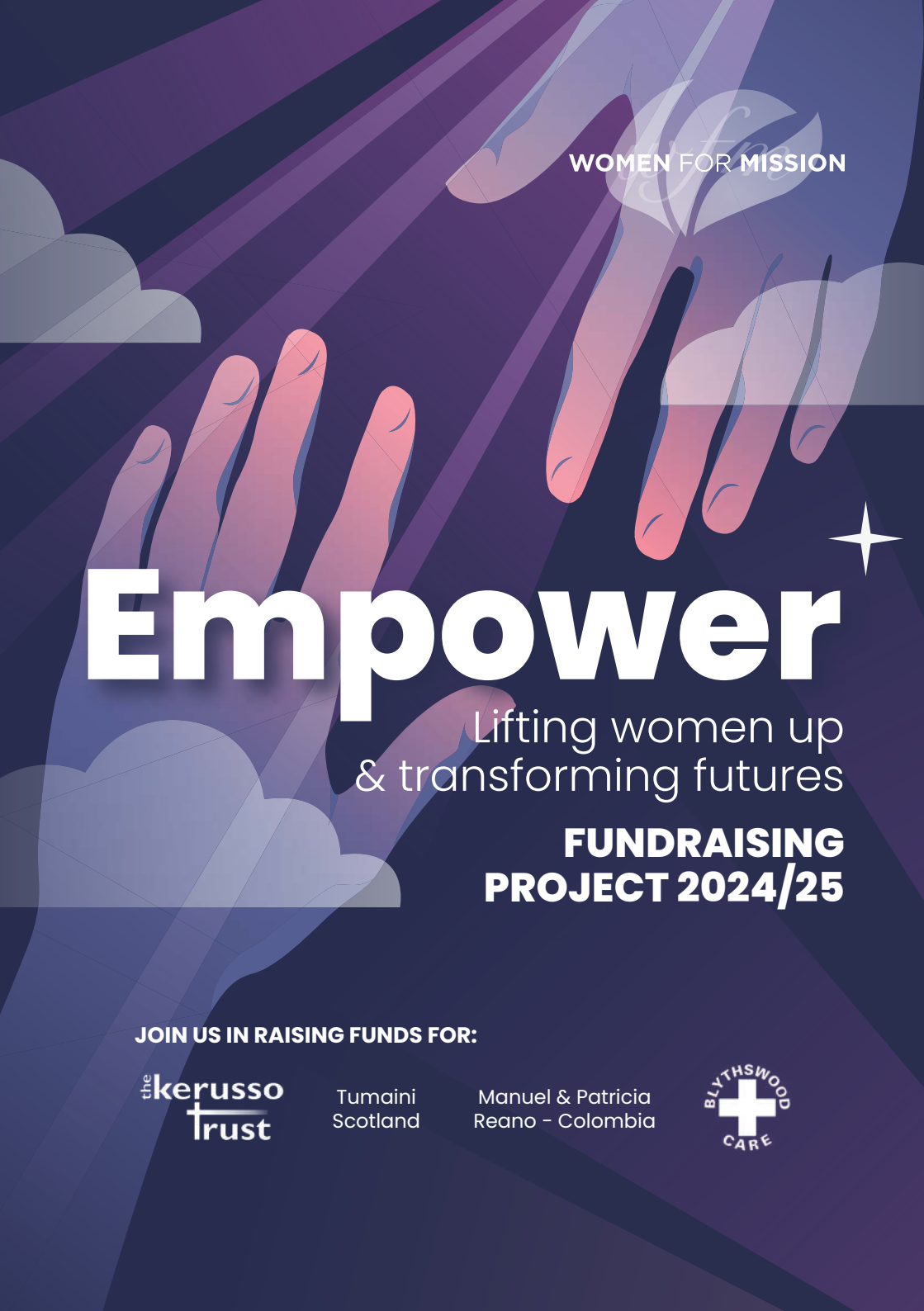

The Blythswood Trust

Blythswood works in the UK, through their Edinburgh and Highland Foodbanks and abroad in Eastern Europe, Africa and India through their education, community and gospel projects.

More than 10,000 girls and women are working in the Turbhe red light district in the Navi Mumbai area of India, many of whom have been trafficked there and are 'owned' by madams who may have 6-10 girls working for them. The Beacon Centre, run by the Cornerstone Trust, in Turbhe has been making a difference in the area for several years.

Funds raised will go towards Blythswood's work with the Beacon Centre and could provide play equipment, school uniform for 100 children and an aluminium roofed shed.



The Kerusso Trust

The Kerusso Trust works with local partners to build the Church and extend God's Kingdom in Malawi. They do this through Bible and ministry training programmes, youth and children's outreach and community development initiatives.

The Kerusso Trust, which was set up in 2011, work primarily in rural areas throughout the country, in partnership with a Malawian Christian organisation, J-Life Ministries, based near the city of Blantyre.

Funds raised will go towards supporting Bethel Girls' Academy, a Christian secondary school which provides opportunity for education to girls from rural backgrounds. Funds will also be used to continue a programme with village chiefs to support the protection of girls and women from harm and abuse, and to develop a sewing training project for women in the rural community to enable them to support their families.

The Reanos - Columbia

The Reanos work with CPCI-Colombia, which began in 1988 and acts as an umbrella for a variety of ministries. In 2015, CPCI started the ministry of Koininos, dedicated to the pastoral care of pastors and their families.

Funds raised for the Reanos aim to bring to these individuals and their families tools, means and opportunities to receive pastoral care and increase their levels of personal, family, relational and spiritual health.



The Tumaini Fund Scotland

The Tumaini Fund Scotland was established in 2014 in order to partner with The Tumaini Fund in Kagera, NW Tanzania as they support widows and orphans affected by HIV. Their vision in Scotland is to help resource our brothers and sisters in Kagera who are currently supporting over 100,000 orphans as well as widows. There are 5 offices run by local co-ordinators (4 of whom are orphans previously supported by Tumaini). The care is mainly provided by a dedicated team of Parish Workers who live alongside those they serve.

In line with their vision and commitment to our brothers and sisters who are serving as Parish Workers, they would like to raise funds to help with practical needs for them.
